The workshop will be a mix of presentations with perinatal examples; and small group work and exercises.

Participants with a firm question for a review (ideally a title registered with a Cochrane review group) will get the most from this workshop.

The workshop will cover:

- Key features of a systematic review
- How to write a protocol for a Cochrane review
- Constructing clinical questions
- Locating studies
- Assessing risk of bias of studies
- Reporting bias
- Introduction to meta-analysis
- Synthesis methods and statistics used to summarise data
